

2. PROFESSIONAL CAREERS IN THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

The construction industry is one of the largest in the world and accounts for over 2 million jobs in the UK. The industry contributes over £110 billion towards UK GDP and its performance is a key indicator on the health of the economy.

The built environment plays an important part in our day to day lives from the houses we live in, to where we work. The UK construction industry has delivered various world renowned projects including iconic buildings such as The Shard in London, which, standing at 309.6m, was the tallest building in Europe following its completion. The UK has also delivered Europe's largest construction project, Crossrail, which employed over 10,000 people across 40 sites.

The iconic Olympic Park, now home to West Ham United Football Club, also stands as testament to the strength of the UK construction industry on a global stage. Construction value totalled £486m and resulted in the spectacular launch of the 2012 Olympic Games which were considered the most successful in history. The Olympics has also left an unrivalled legacy, having regenerated the East End of London, stimulating economic growth and continuing to provide a sustainable environment for future generations.

Industry professionals are governed by various professional bodies that are recognised both nationally and internationally, including RIBA, CIBSE and RICS¹. The Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors was formed in 1868 and now has over 134,000 members across 150 countries worldwide.

Salaries are competitive and comparable with other leading sectors at all grades with opportunities for rapid progression available for exceptional candidates.



“Leaving school, I achieved 11 A*-C GCSE’s and 4 A Levels and from there, I chose to begin my journey into construction as a Trainee Surveyor. Combining work at Baily Garner and University, I studied 1 day per week, with the remaining 4 days in the office. After graduating with a degree in Building Surveying from London South Bank University I worked as an Assistant Building Surveyor whilst studying towards my APC. Since becoming Chartered I have progressed through the business and am now proud to be an Associate Partner, responsible for our work in the Education sector, in which I am involved heavily in running projects and client liaison.”

What interested you in starting a career in building surveying?

I have been around the construction industry my whole life, as my father and brother both work within the sector. Having this first-hand exposure, I became interested in construction, drawings and the development of a project as I grew up and now I find myself working on projects I used to watch my family work on. It is a great sense of achievement to now be involved.

What is your position and how long have you been at the firm?

I am an Associate Partner and responsible for our work in the Education sector across the business. I joined Baily Garner in 2010 as a School leaver and the practice supported me through my part-time undergraduate degree course, studying 1 day per week at university and working in the office 4 days per week. Baily Garner is different from our competitors as those more experienced individuals have direct involvement in the development of junior members of staff and helping with training from commencing a degree through to RICS membership. What is your role and what type of projects and clients are you involved with?

I am the Programme Manager for Education within our Building Surveying department. In my role, projects we are involved in vary, from small scale refurbishment of existing education buildings to large scale expansion projects consisting of

new build and extensions to existing facilities. Our clients also vary, and include local authorities, individual schools, and multi-academy trusts, which can consist of anything up to in excess of 50 academies. The most interesting part of the job is the variety of schemes and dealing with clients. Every job that we embark on is different, and there are varying needs of each client. It is interesting and a valuable learning experience to deal with clients, as it builds your people skills and ability to communicate with all types of individuals. What is your position and how long have you been at the firm?

I am a Junior Mechanical Engineer based at the Birmingham office and have been at Baily Garner for nearly 2 years. I started with doing an internship here after I graduated from my Master’s degree in Mechanical Engineering and after 1 month I became a permanent employee.

What interested you in starting a career in building services engineering?

My passion for engineering sparked from enjoying tech lessons at school, especially the practical lessons where I got to do metal and woodwork. From there I became interested in Engineering and wanted to expand my knowledge further and get into higher education to become a qualified Mechanical Engineer.

What is your role and what type of projects and clients are you involved with?

QUANTITY SURVEYING

What is your position and how long have you been at the firm?

I joined Baily Garner over 3 years ago. I am an Assistant Quantity Surveyor based in the Birmingham office. I am also 4 years into my 5-year degree at Birmingham City University, studying BSc Quantity Surveying and aiming towards getting chartered.

What interested you in starting an apprenticeship in quantity surveying?

My dad is a Quantity Surveyor, so growing up I got to go to work with him so that sparked my interest. I always knew that I wanted to do an apprenticeship degree, as it provides the best opportunity to get experience in

the working environment whilst studying, but I found it hard to find opportunities. However Baily Garner did a presentation at my Sixth Form on apprenticeships in construction, and already being good at maths, I found Quantity Surveying was right up my alley. I provided them with my CV, had a couple of interviews and as they say, the rest is history!

What is your role and what type of projects and clients are you involved with?

My work is varied as I'm gaining experience in both Quantity Surveying and Project Management throughout all the RIBA stages of work, from feasibilities and tenders to end of defects management. It's

very difficult to describe a typical day as everyday I am lucky enough to do something different, from being in the office to going on site. That for me is the best thing about this job. 

4. NEXT STEPS

For interested candidates, two principal career paths exist as detailed here.



ROUTE 1 – SCHOOL LEAVERS AT 16 (GCSE)

For school leavers at 16, a formal programme of study starts with a foundation programme combining a vocational qualification with work experience at Baily Garner. This includes the following:

2-year part-time NVQ Level 3 or T Levels in Surveying or Construction



Part-time NVQ Level 4 (HNC) or NVQ Level 5 (HND) leading to university entry in year 2 or 3



Part-time RICS, RIBA or CIBSE approved NVQ Level 6 (BSc/BA degree)

Note: NVQ Level 3 and T Levels are equivalent to AS and A Levels; entry requirements for HNC (NVQ Level 4) and HND (NVQ Level 5) are minimum one A Level (NVQ Level 3).

ROUTE 2 – SCHOOL LEAVERS AT 18 (A OR T LEVELS)

For school leavers with A or T Levels, two principal options exist depending upon your final results as detailed below:

Option 1

Part-time NVQ Level 4 (HNC) or NVQ Level 5 (HND) leading to university entry in year 2 or 3



Part-time RICS, RIBA or CIBSE accredited NVQ Level 6 (undergraduate degree)

Option 2

Five-year part-time RICS, RIBA or CIBSE accredited NVQ Level 6 (undergraduate degree)

All candidates are advised to ensure they meet the relevant entry requirements for university and college organisations, noting that most university courses will require five GCSEs with grades 4-9 in Maths and English.

All of these options are on an 'earn as you learn' basis, supported by a training plan with one day per week day release to college or university. We have a strong partnership with a number of colleges and universities both locally and nationally.
