




The construction industry is one of the largest in the world and accounts for over 2 million jobs in the UK. The industry contributes over £110 billion towards UK GDP and its performance is a key indicator on the health of the economy.

The built environment plays an important part in our day to day lives from the houses we live in, to where we work. The UK construction industry has delivered various world renowned projects including iconic buildings such as The Shard in London, which, standing at 309.6m, was the tallest building in Europe following its completion. The UK is also delivering Europe's largest construction project in Crossrail, employing over 10,000 people across 40 sites.

The iconic Olympic Park, now home to West Ham United Football Club, also stands as testament to the strength of the UK construction industry on a global stage. Construction value totalled £486m and resulted in the spectacular launch of the 2012 Olympic Games which were considered the most successful in history. The Olympics has also left an unrivalled legacy, having regenerated the East End of London, stimulating economic growth and continuing to provide a sustainable environment for future generations.

Industry professionals are governed by various professional bodies that are recognised both nationally and worldwide including RIBA, CIBSE and RICS¹. The Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors formed in 1898, now has over 160,000 members across 46 countries worldwide.

Levels of salaries are competitive and comparable with other leading sectors at all grades with opportunities for rapid progression available for exceptional candidates. It is a fast moving sector with a range of opportunities to suit all. "Following my degree, I joined Baily Garner in 2003 to gain more practical experience. I have now been qualified for five years working as an Associate Partner and Project Team Leader on a variety of schemes including estate regeneration and education masterplans."

What is your position and how long have you been at the firm?

I am a qualified Architect and
Project Manager and have been
working at Baily Garner since
2003 on a mix of full time and part
time basis. I initially started at the
company as a Part 1 Architectural
Assistant. When I returned back
to university to complete my Part
2 post graduate diploma, Baily
Garner paid for my tuition fees so
I could complete it as a full time
student. I then returned to Baily
Garner after my studies to work
while I prepared for my Part 3
qualification as an Architect.

What is your role and what type of projects and clients are you involved with?

My current role within the practice is Associate Partner as well as a Project Team Leader, which means I lead of a variety of schemes and am also the key client contact. As an Architect. I am in a role where I can work on a range of different tasks during the week from feasibility designs to detailed planning submissions. I am mainly involved in housing and regeneration projects, but I also have experience in education schemes, so my clients can vary from a Housing Association to a Board of Governors for a School.

What is the most interesting part of your job?

For me, its balancing what the residents or end users need

with what we are able to do, for example managing high aspirations and expectations with a limited budget. On our schemes we aim to involve as many of the stakeholders in consultations as possible as this helps highlight key issues and concerns which we may not have considered.

What interested you in starting a career in architecture?

A lot of my family are involved in the construction industry, from Engineers to Developers. Being surrounded by them at a young age fuelled my enthusiasm for construction and particularly housing, which is my passion. Housing can be such a personal process, as it's about understanding how people live and what's important to that demographic. The changing

face of housing as well, and what we expect from our homes, is a challenging and fulfilling design process.

Working in an interdisciplinary environment has helped me gain a better appreciation for other disciplines within the practice and also understand how they work and their priorities. How long have you been at the firm?

I joined Baily Garner in May 2011 after successfully graduating from Nottingham Trent University with a 2:1 in Building Surveying. In November 2013, following a tremendous amount of internal support, I successfully completed my RICS assessment and became a Chartered Surveyor. Following this success, in May 2017 I was promoted to Associate Partner and am now head of our commercial division.

What attracted you to Baily Garner and how long have you been with the company?

During my year out I worked with Derwent Living in Derby. What is your position and how long have you been at the firm?

I have a BSc Degree qualification in Building Service Engineering which I obtained studying on a part time basis which allowed me to continue to work at the same time. 
What interested you in starting a career in building services?
